Hinduism – Diwali – Festival of Light

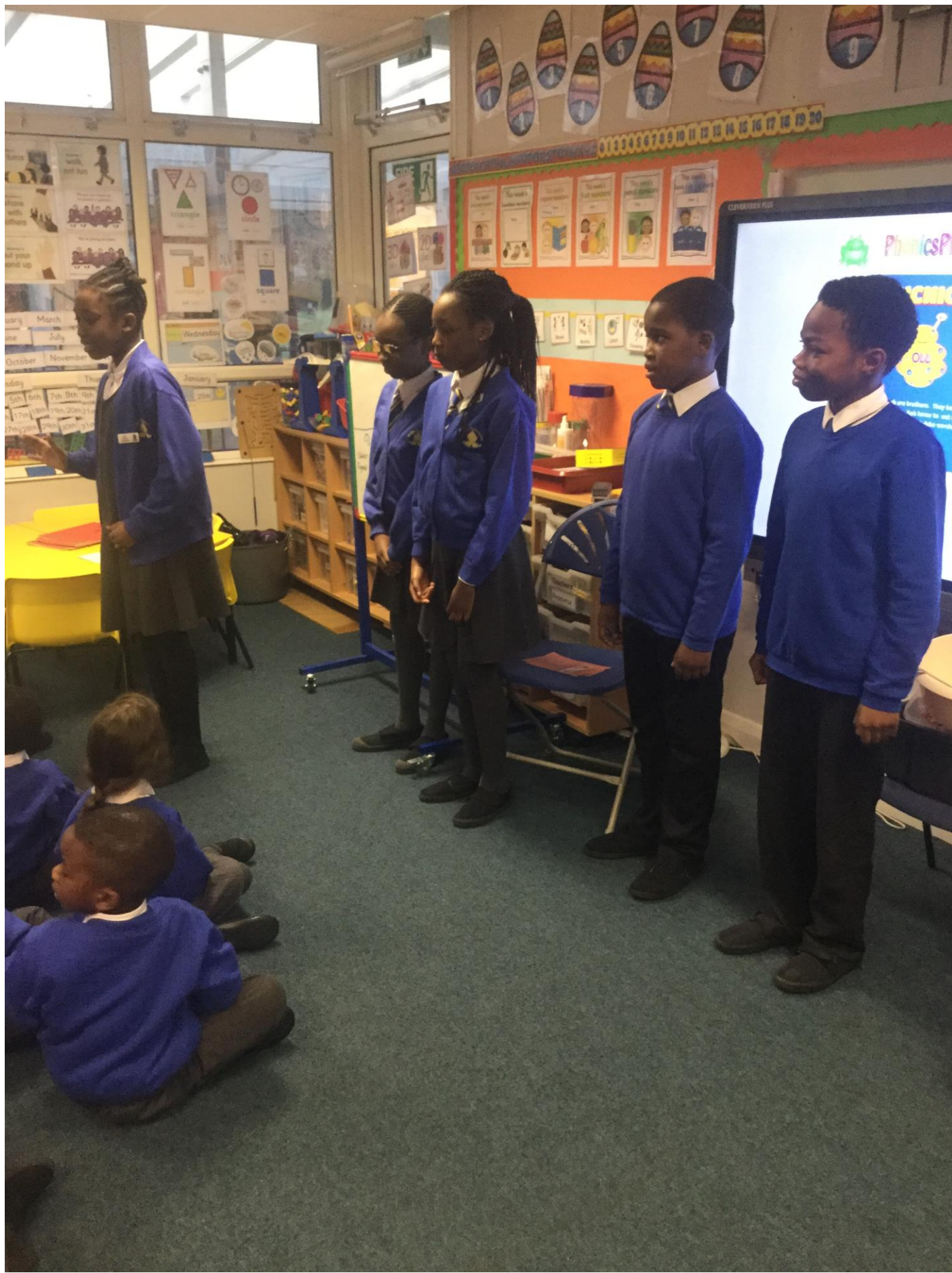
Islam – A tale of Two Frogs

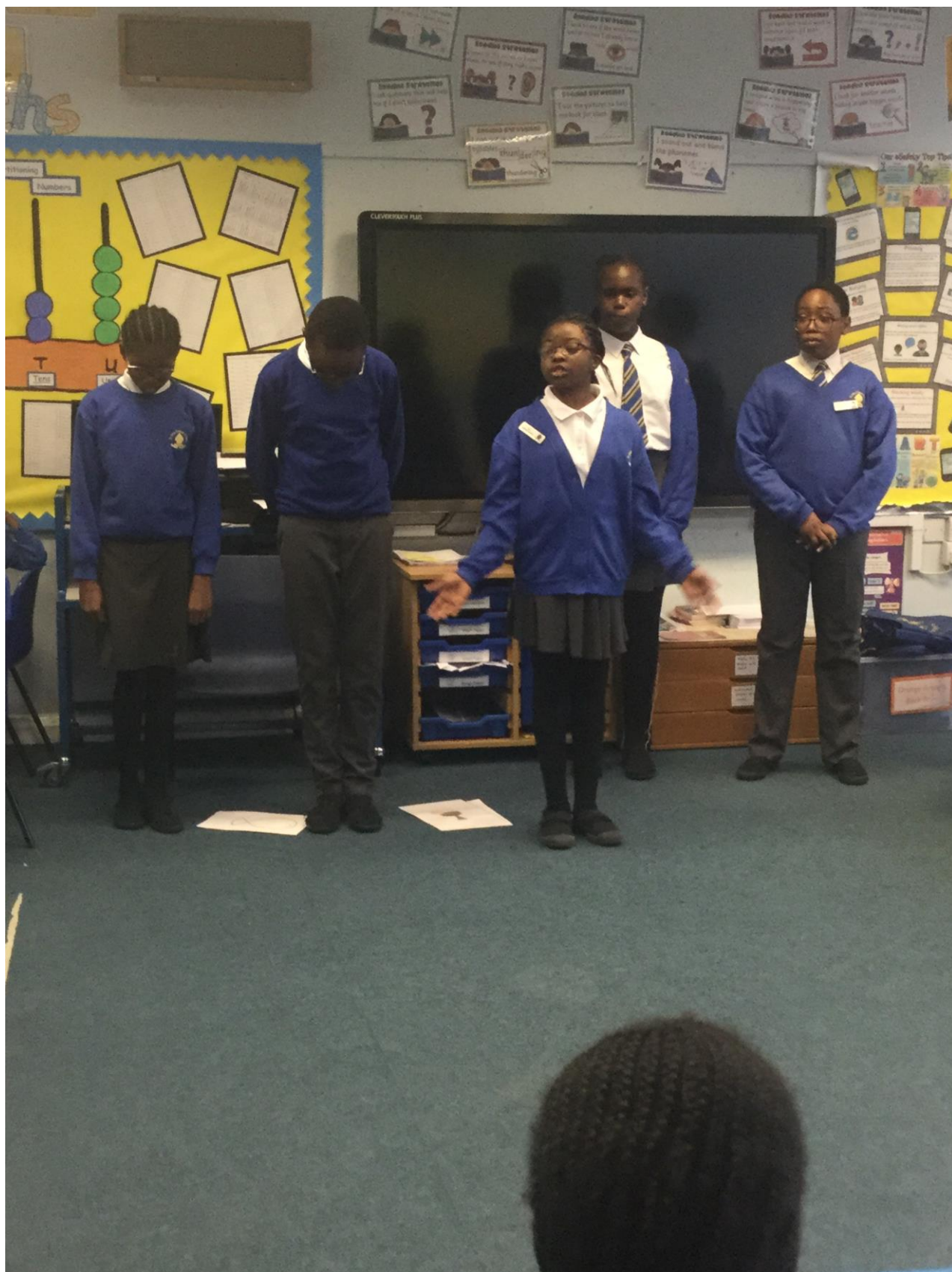
The story tellers had to tell their story and not read from a book.

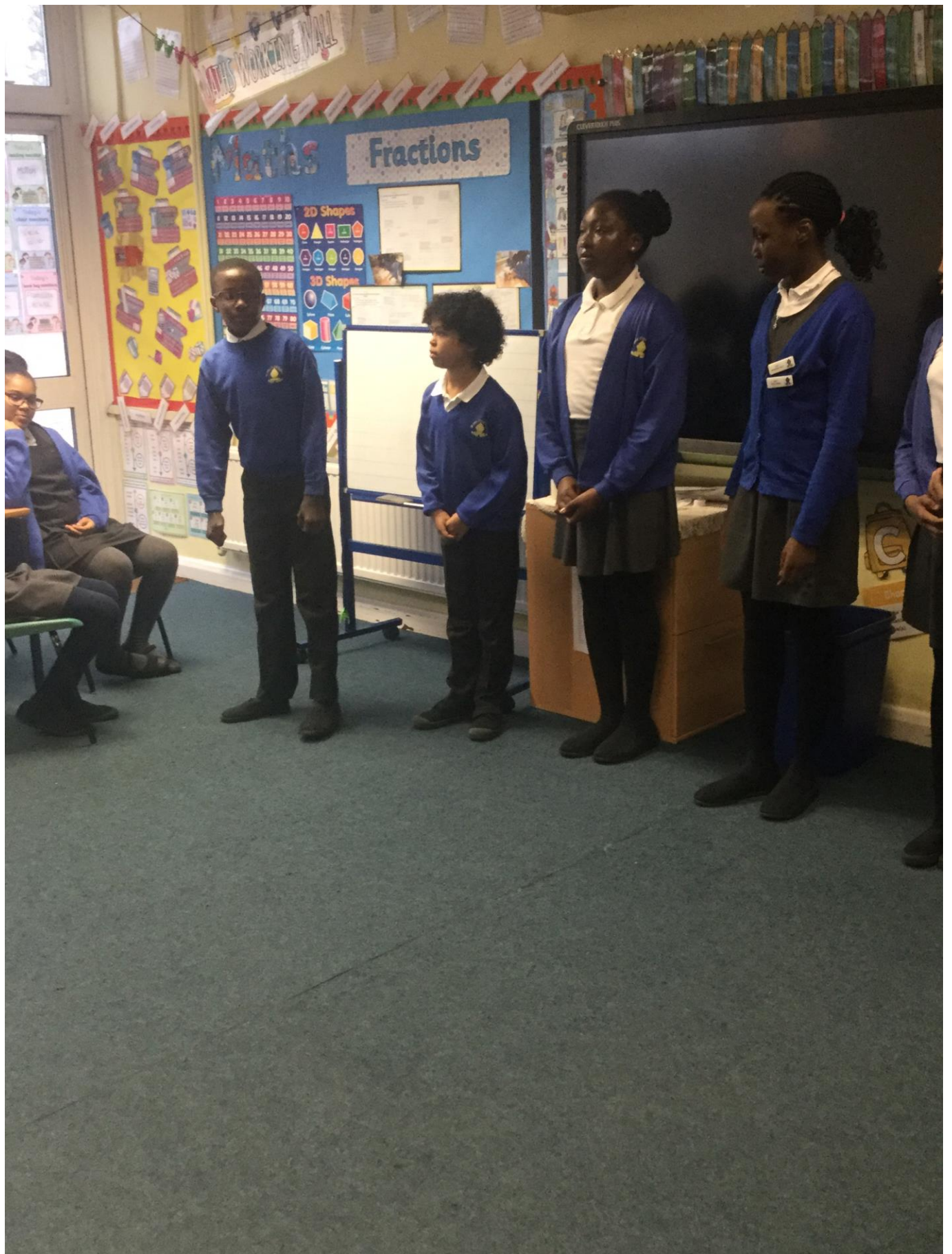
Skills developed were performing skills, storytelling skills, research skills and language skills.

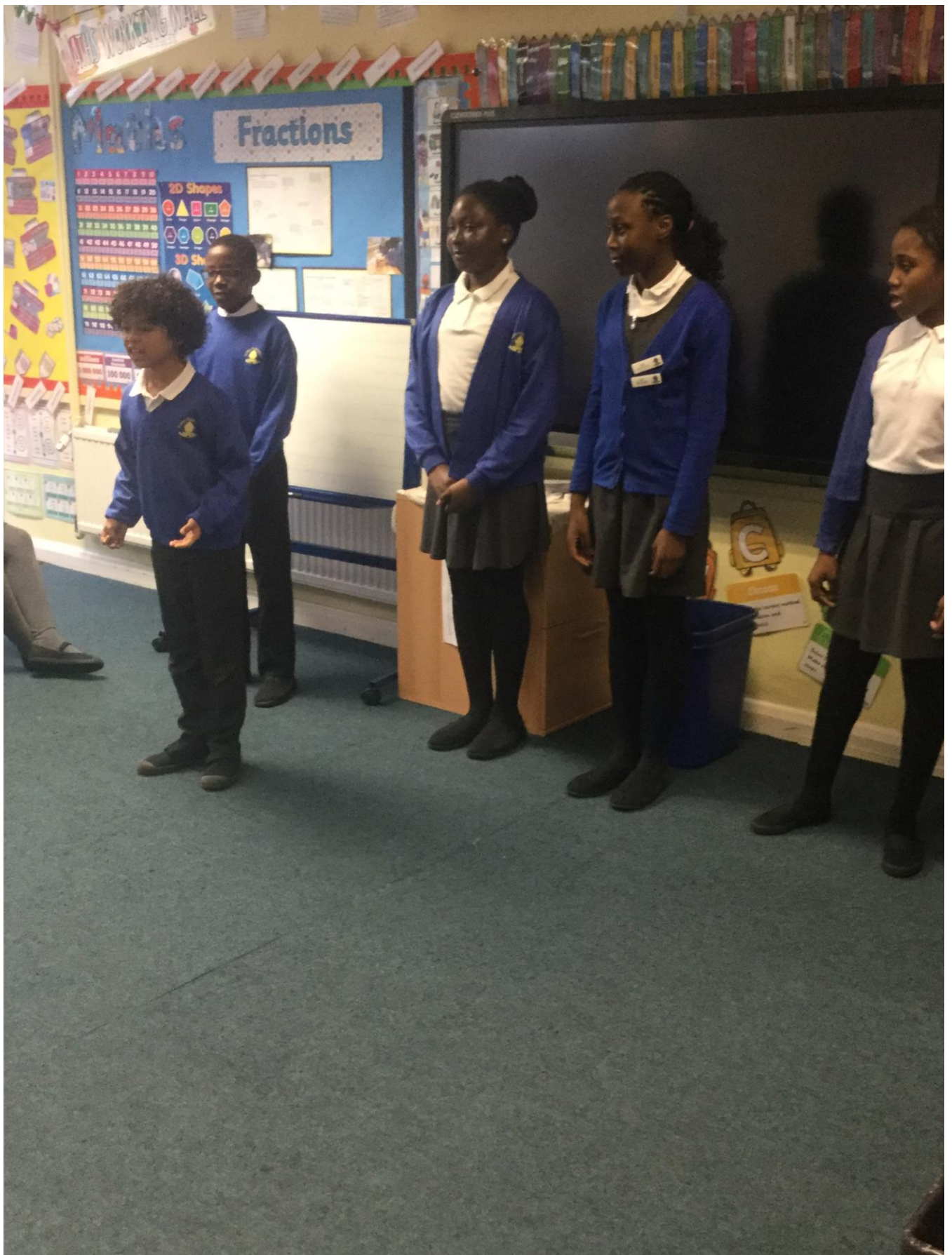
Each group performed to each year group, spreading the joy of storytelling through religion to the whole school.

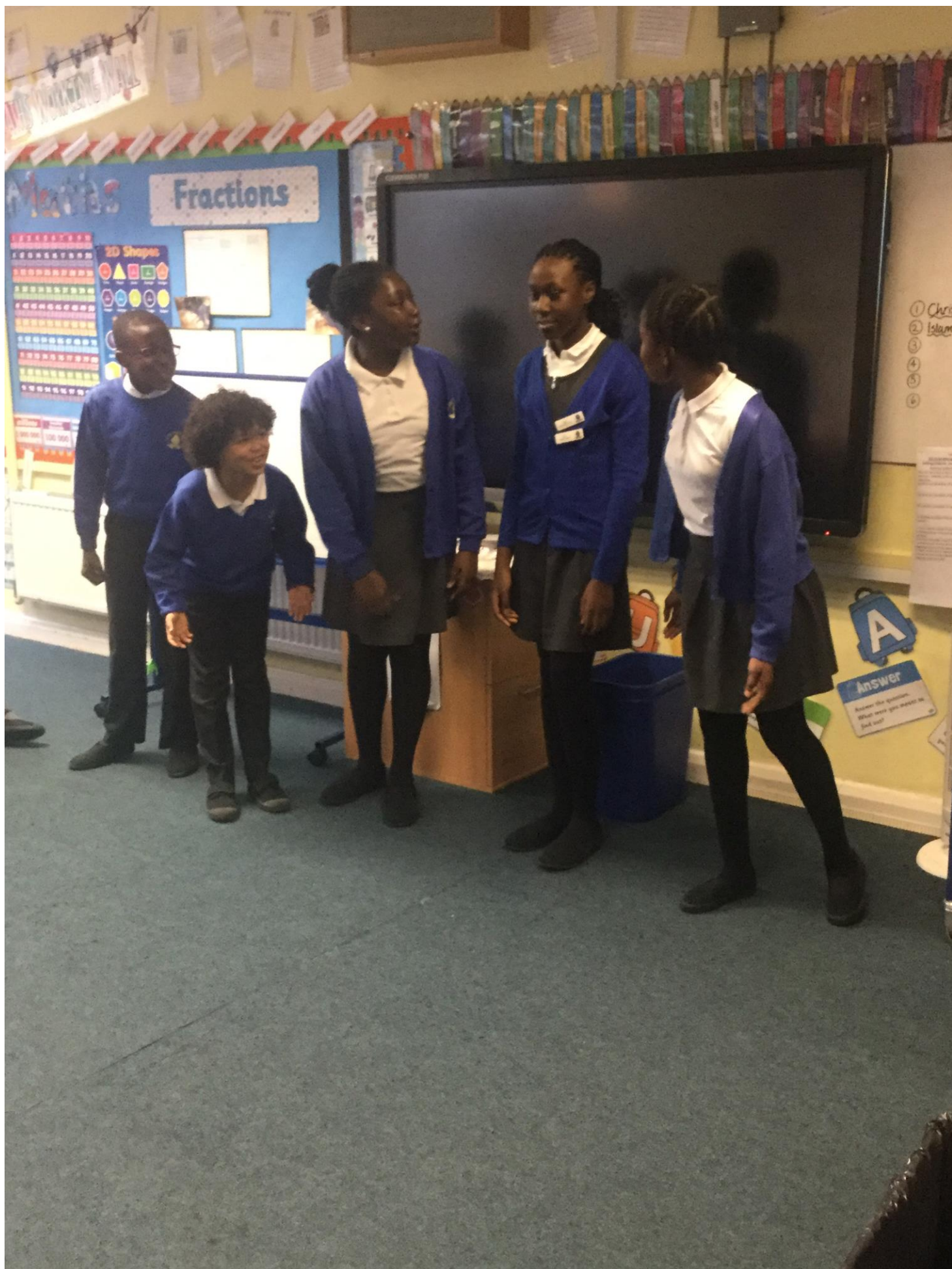

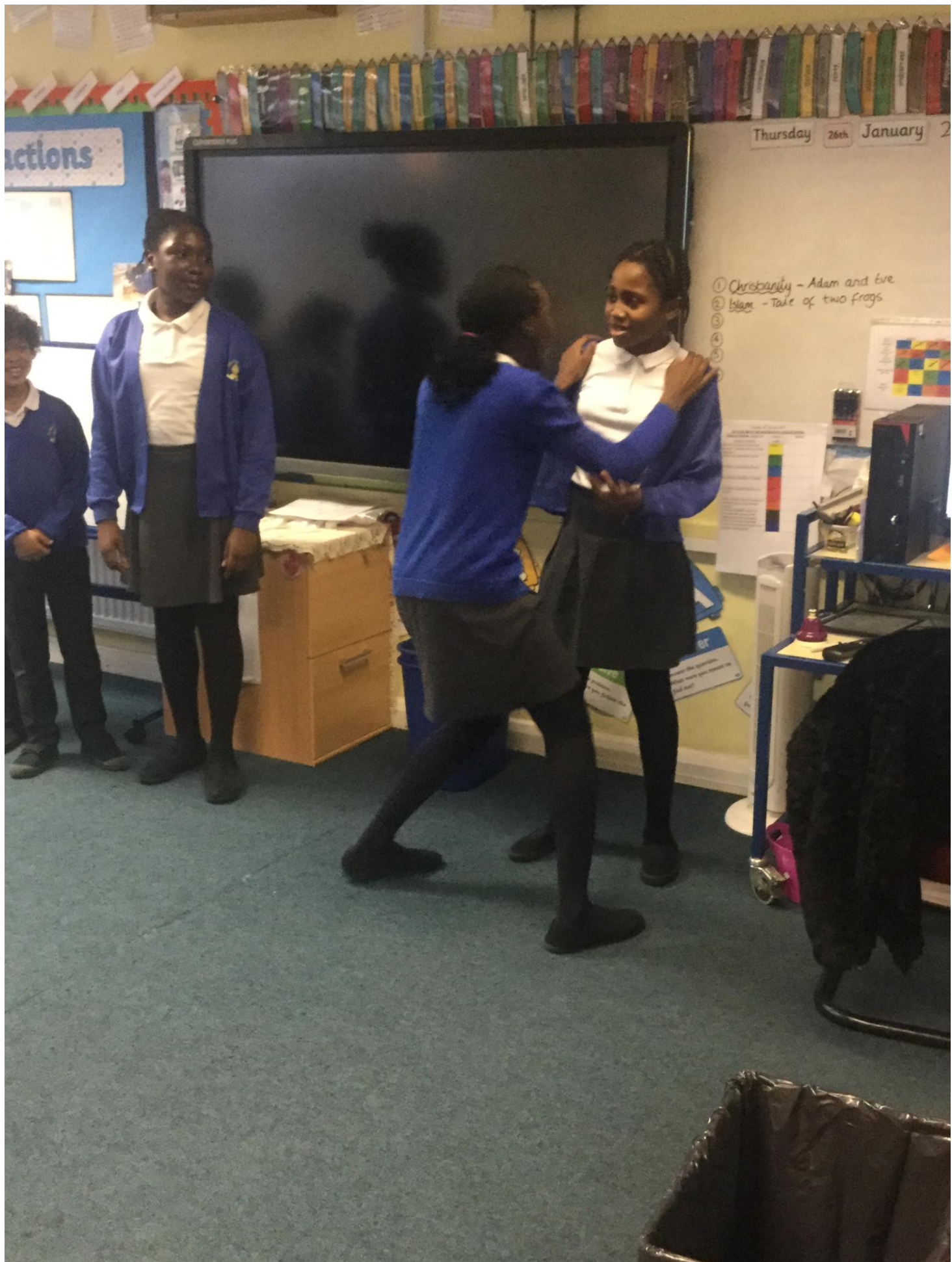
