'Near miss' incidents and positive cases among staff must be recorded Staff have access to a 24-hour Carefirst EAP counselling and advice service where schools have subscribed. School Heads encourage active communication between staff on concerns and ensure staff read all communications and this includes senior leaders and governing bodies. Senior leaders implement working practices promoting a good work-life balance. School Governing Bodies must be involved in overseeing this risk assessment and its implementation at local level. Some pupils may be experiencing a variety of emotions in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, such as anxiety, stress or low mood. They should not come into school if they have symptoms, have had a positive test result or other reasons requiring them to stay at home due to the risk of them passing on COVID-19 (for example, they are required to quarantine). If anyone in your school develops <u>COVID-19 symptoms</u>, however mild, you should send them home and they should follow public health advice. Asymptomatic testing is necessary to reduce the risk of transmission within schools. Staff must undertake twice weekly home tests throughout all of September. Those who test positive must isolate for 10 days and take a confirmatory polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test and continue to isolate if the result is positive. Schools must be prepared to support home learning for any pupils who are well enough to study if tested positive. New guidance is that for under-18s, irrespective of their vaccination status, and double vaccinated adults, will not need to self-isolate if they are a close contact of a positive case. They will be strongly advised to take a PCR test and, if positive, will need to isolate. People who feel unwell should stay at home and should not attend work or any education setting. Communicate to staff and parents the importance of following national guidelines in staff briefings, emails and website information. Risk assessment to be shared with staff and parents. Should any staff member, child, or family member of those groups, be tested positive for COVID19, everyone in that group will qualify for testing Any staff member, parent, child or their families, will qualify for testing if they show any symptoms of COVID19. This testing should be done as soon as is possible, so that contact tracing can be done, and all contacts can be informed that they have had contact.
